[From Our Pastor: Prepare for Visitors]

What makes a first-time visitor want to return? Seven points of contact. People are looking for smiling church people who make them feel truly at home.

The Bible tells us in Romans 15:7, "Welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God." With that in mind, here are seven ways we can prepare to welcome visitors.

Be approachable. Friendly greeters at the door set the tone for a visitor's experience. A genuine smile, a warm handshake, eye contact, and asking their names helps people feel noticed, important, and appreciated. Anticipating questions (like where the bathrooms are!) will also put visitors at ease.

Be hospitable. Notice when visitors enter the sanctuary. Go and greet them and ask them their names. Make sure they have a bulletin, and then kindly offer to help them to find a seat, and sit with them (even if that means sitting in someone else's pew - gasp! - they will move). This helps visitors to feel at peace and not anxious over where to sit. Introduce them to the other families sitting near them.

Be proactive. Present visitors with a welcome gift bag, and share about our church. Explain the service format and worship style, so our visitors feel informed rather than lost. Be ready to include what we believe. This gives visitors insight into our church's life and faith.

Be connectional. Offer to introduce the visiting families to the pastor. Introduce them again by name. Kindly ask them for their contact information. This balances reverence with warmth, and helps visitors feel like they are a part of something meaningful.

Be deep. Offer visitors clear ways to get involved beyond Sunday service. Invite them to coffee and doughnuts. Show them where classes meet, and make sure they are aware of small groups, service projects, and social events going on at the church. This gives them a reason to return.

Be thankful. Follow up with visitors. This can be as simple as sending them a handwritten note, and email, or a phone call thanking them for attending. A small gesture of gratitude and a reminder that we are looking forward to seeing them again helps visitors feel valued beyond their initial visit.

Be loving. Take a plate of cookies or brownies (or any yummy dish) to their house during the week. Acts of kindness like this prove our love, and may be the very thing that helps someone truly feel at home – leading them to call our church their spiritual home.

By focusing on these seven points of contact, we will help visitors feel more than just welcome – we will create an environment where they feel they belong and want to return. Let's be ready to make a lasting impression by sharing the love, joy, and hope of Christ with all who come through our doors!



### **PASTOR APPRECIATION MONTH**



### **Using Your Gifts**

Through gifted individuals – that that means you and I – God provides for His Church all that is need to accomplish his work. Everything he has commanded us to do he has equipped us to carry out. #### Stewardship Corner

Everything we have is a trust from God. It may seem that we own our homes or cars because our names are on the titles, but, as Christian stewards, we realize that we own nothing. We are only caretakers of what God gives us. God is the owner and provider, and He will determine how much we will have and how long we will have it. "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it" (Psalm 24:1).

### What Are Conference & District Tithes Used For?

As United Methodists, we are connected by a common faith and mission, which we work through conferences that reflect our fellowship. One way we support each other is through conference and district tithes (previously called apportionments). This covenant reflects our good stewardship of the gifts and grace God gives to us.

Our Conference tithe (10% of our income) and our district tithe (1.5% of income) enable the Indiana Conference and Central District to minister the redemptive love of Jesus to a world in need. Our support helps provide space, equipment, supplies, and special staff for Annual Conference; church development; multiplication cultures; educational events; grants for new worship services; peace and justice ministries; daily administration; communications; leadership development; and connectional ministries like camps for youth and Children Matter Most.

We want to be good stewards not only of Mohawk United Methodist Church, but of our district and conference as well. Currently this year (2024) we are giving 4% of our income. We would like increase this amount. We need everyone to help. We need everyone to give a little more so that we can fully participate in the common faith and mission we share as United Methodists.
